



## Helmet mask, Kuba/Kete people, Democratic Republic of Congo

The primary ritual context of this mask is during funerals, especially funerals of senior titleholders. The most visible reference to death is the colour red, which predominates on Kuba masks. They are used during initiation ceremonies where they are associated with the nature spirits and are responsible for guarding the initiation camp and helping to train the novices.
